

BEAT LEPROSY

World Leprosy Day is observed internationally every year on the last Sunday of January to increase the public awareness of Leprosy or Hansen's Disease. This date was chosen by French humanitarian Raoul Follereau as a tribute to the life of Mahatma Gandhi who had compassion for people afflicted with leprosy. It is one of the oldest recorded diseases in the world. Follereau created World Leprosy Day with two goals: to advocate for the equal treatment of persons affected by leprosy and to reeducate the public about leprosy by correcting historical misconceptions surrounding the disease. It is an infectious chronic disease that targets the nervous system, especially the nerves in the cooler parts of the body: the hands, feet and face.

We unite around one goal: Beat Leprosy. This World Leprosy Day, we invite you to help spread the word that LeprosyIs Curable, join in the

fight to End Stigma, and advocate for the Mental Wellbeing of persons who have experienced leprosy and other neglected tropical diseases.

On World Leprosy Day we raise public awareness of leprosy, including the medical and social implications of the disease and the rights of persons affected. Social



media campaigns, community parades, school programming, and

cultural events are held around the world in the weeks leading up to World Leprosy Day.

Around the world:

- An estimated 2 to 3 million people are living with Hansen's diseaserelated disabilities globally.
- The countries with the highest number of new diagnoses were India, Brazil, and Indonesia, followed by some of the nations in Africa.
- Two-thirds of all new cases of Hansen's disease are diagnosed in India, which remains home to a third of the world's poor, a group disproportionately affected by the disease.

Hansen's disease mainly affects people in resource-poor countries who live in crowded conditions and have difficulty accessing health care due to long distances to clinics familiar with Hansen's disease, and high cost of going to the doctor. Because of this, despite the WHO's program to provide treatment for free, many of those affected don't complete it or don't receive it at all. In addition, due the continued stigma against people with Hansen's disease, they may not seek help when first symptoms appear, causing delay in diagnosis and development of disabilities

Girls and women affected by Hansen's disease face the added issue of gender and social discrimination, which may also delay detection of the disease. In some countries, the law allows a person to legally divorce a spouse because they are affected by the disease. Unfortunately, this may leave many women destitute, homeless, and unable to care for their children.

Many people living with Hansen's disease are unable to work due to disability caused by the disease or may face stigma that prevents them from working.

The good news is that Hansen's disease is curable. Education and improving access to basic health services for all are keys to successful elimination of stigma and disability associated with the illness.

Dear esteemed IMA members,

Greetings from IMA Karnataka State Branch.

Thank you all for celebrating the Republic day on 26th January, 2021 at all branches.

We heard, saw and came across so many changes & difficult times across the globe for the last one year once COVID-19 was notified as Public health emergency of International concern on 30th Jan, 2020. Times have passed where we lost so many in the world and unfortunately so many of our own colleagues of different ages of the esteemed profession.

It appears that the major difficult times are almost over and there is the boon of vaccinations against the corona virus now available. All of us know that whenever there is viral pandemic, theoretically viral particles stay in the area/city for nearly 10 years depending on the transmission with

our previous experiences. Virus can stay as endemic or as seasonal epidemics in the areas.

All of us as ambassadors of human health, need to get vaccinated with adequate number of prescribed doses to develop the required immunity ourselves, without developing the disease when accidentally exposed to viruses. KINDLY TAKE IT AS PRIORITY WHEN TURN COMES.

I was one of the Principal Investigators of one Hexavalent Vaccine for small babies now in the market. The local reactions like pain, swelling, etc. were not much reported in my vaccine study for small babies. Even rarely, if a baby had any local reaction, it came down with 1 or 2 doses of paracetamol. Here, I mention that many of us have already taken vaccination but we are coming to know that there are reports of reluctance from health workers in media groups becoming viral as videos and news. The false propaganda is likely to harm the vaccination

programmes. Though the critic reports say that vaccines have come so early into effect, it is due to the ease of logistics for emergency use. It is a sufficiently good time that vaccine has passed safety standards. Hence, we need to complete the doses as per schedule. Also, we know from National IMA headquarters that IMA has joined hands for vaccinating every one.

Though we are taking vaccinations & opening most of the establishments, along with our health care staff, it is our duty to continue exercising the precautions what we were taking to prevent Covid-19 before the vaccine arrival and lockdown period. All these will send messages to Public health as well.

We request all our esteemed IMA members in our state to update your correct

name, your mobile number, Email address for verification at your IMA branch office as per the directions of National IMA Headquarters for easy verification process to get ID card, Certificate yourself online.


