### Following are the few important days

### 1] World Diabetes Day on 14th November:

The theme for this year is "Access to diabetic care".

### Ladies and Gentle men,

Indian Medical Association is a voluntary organisation of Doctors of modern scientific system of medicine and also is largest non-government medical organisation in the world.

The objects of our Association are promoting the improvement of public health, medical education, research and working with state and central governments in health care.

It is because of latest developments in modern medicine that infant mortality, a sensitive index of health care delivery of any country which was 195 per 1000 live births in 1947 has come down to 32. (in Udupi district it is 5.93, and Kerala it is below 4), M.M.R is 0.113 percent (113 per lakh live births, it is 86.94 per lakh in Udupi). Complex surgeries are now possible in India including major organ donations, that too at most reasonable cost. India is hub of

medical tourism in the world now. Earlier rich and politicians used to go to western countries for complex medical and surgical treatment, now it is vice-versa. Life expectancy has increased up to 70.8 years from 31yrs in 1947.

Even during Covid19 Pandemic, which has played havoc in the world, India managed the situation satisfactorily due to the dedicated efficient management, by the involvement of both private and government doctors paramedical staff round the clock and reduced the mortality to around 1.8.%. Vaccination campaign in India is one of the best in the world. In spite of overburden of 138 crore population. India is the only country in the world to vaccinate more than 100 crore doses by now.

In spite of all positive developments in the medical field, faith is gradually being reduced on doctors, due to various factors. Commercialisation of medical education and medical profession due to irresponsible Governments, their attitude and rules. We should also introspect our self, how health care delivery can be improved in our country, by constant proper dialogues in our association, as well as with the Governments.

### **Rural Health Service**

India has rural population in majority, and agriculture is main source of income. If we can take care of rural health it will prove a long way in improving national health. Government is not only spending less than

1.2 to 1.6% of GDP in health, health facilities are concentrated in urban area and rural population is neglected. Government is shedding crocodile tears that doctors are not going to rural area. But if Government can provide adequate infrastructure with proper pay scale, adequate paramedical staff and security, IMA is ready to take the challenge of providing doctors to rural service. The live example to prove this is now hundreds of doctors are ready to join compulsory rural service, but government is not utilising their service, as there are no sufficient vacancies. Government can increase number of posts and can absorb them if they mind it, instead of wasting money in unnecessary projects. Health and Education should be given first priority for the development of the nation.

### **Eradication of Quackery**

There is threat to public health by quacks. It is estimated that more than 12.68 lacs registered modern medicine in India and there are more than 1.25 lakhs quacks in Karnataka alone. Added to this there is crosspathy of modern medicine by ayush and homeopathy doctors. Only by creating awareness in public and strict legal action against quacks can curb this menace. IMA requests every IMA member to enlist the quacks practising in their area with address to State anti-quackery committee for addressing this problem.

### Crosspathy

Prescription of modern medicine by non-MBBS Doctors can be injurious to

health or even fatal. It takes 10 years to study what is right and what is wrong. Doctors of other system can not learn by short course. We hail present government for withdrawing the circular of allowing Ayush Doctors to use modern medicine drugs in emergency in Government medical establishments after short training. However present government is confused and has allowed integrated doctors to use modern medicines which is not only illegal, but also contempt of Supreme Court order which has repeatedly held that no person can prescribe modern medicine unless his/her name is registered in MCI(NMC) or State medical register. We have to oppose this circular legally by filing a writ in High Court of Karnataka.

### **KPME ACT**

To Address the demand of anti-quackery act by IMA, Karnataka government has brought KPME act in 2007, which got implemented in 2010. However amendments in 2017 are having ingredients which are impractical. Quacks are more comfortable under this amended act, than qualified doctors and medical establishments. As per section 14 of Indian Constitution, government should have included government medical institutions also. Hence IMA opposes this act tooth and nail. IMA Puttur has filed a writ against this act in High Court of Karnataka. IMA KSB will implied in this writ and try to see that the KPME Act is squashed.

### **PC-PNDT ACT**

Preconception and prenatal diagnostic Technique act is an act, to stop female foeticide and to arrest declining male to female sex ratio. IMA welcomes this act. Doctors Against Sex Selection(DASS) Committee is formed at national level and state level to assist the government in this endeavour. But this act has many ingredients such as for minor clerical errors, doctors are punished with seizure of ultrasound machine and imprisonment. Even registration and renewal fee is unreasonably high. IMA strongly demands to amend this act, to remove such unreasonable ingredients.

# Assault on Doctors and Medical Establishments

Assault on doctors and medical establishments are increasing day by day. As per information 75% of doctors and 48% of ICU's are attacked. In many instances doctors and staff have sustained serious injuries even leading to death and hospital properties have been damaged. Antisocial elements join attendants of patient and cause harm. All these violences are in increasing trend during Covid19 Pandemic.

IMA urges doctors to follow Ethics. No doctor wish to cause harm to the patient's health. In majority of cases there is no negligence of doctors and staff. Due to severity of disease and late arrival to medical treatment, there may be deaths, which can not be avoided even in best of the best institutions with best of the best treatment made available.

Karnataka government has passed an act, Karnataka Prohibition of Violence against Medical Service personnel and damage to medicare institutions Act-2009. But this act is mild with imprisonment up to 3 years only. Hence culprits get bail easily. Hence we urge this act to be made more effective by increasing the imprisonment above 7 years, so that bail will not be granted easily. Only this act is implemented strictly, it will protect doctors, staff and properties. Unfortunately Police officials are not taking immediate and timely steps. to protect the doctors and paramedical staff.

Even Epidemic Act by central government is also toothless as punishment awarded is less than 7 years. And the act will be applicable only during epidemic. We request both State and Central Governments to amend the acts suitably to make it more effective.

### **Consumer Protection Act**

Our long waiting demand for capping of the compensation is still pending. There are no guidelines for awarding compensation. Compensation should not bring financial crisis to the doctor. In some instances Courts have been unreasonable to award as high as 11 crores compensation, making the survival of doctor impossible.

Even in CPA act 2019, initially medical profession was included. But after the report of Parliamentary Standing Committee the medical service in this act was dropped. However it is left to the decision of Apex court how to interpret it. Hence sword is still hanging over our head.

### National Medical Mission Bill

The earlier Medical Council of India was managed by able and highly educated personalities in medical field. The medical council of India was constituted by parliament of India through the MCI act 1956. It was an autonomous body with representation from all states, but Niti ayog has proposed the NMC bill and Govt of India has implemented it inspite of strong objections. This bill is antidemocratic, as major number of members in NMC are nominated officials. It is anti federal, as at a given time all states are not represented. It is anti poor as private medical colleges are free to collect fees as per their whims and fancies. There are more possibilities for corruption, as many officials are nominated, not elected. There is also more chances for quackery as it allows Para medical persons to practice modern medicine. It encourages crosspathy as inter facing of modern medicine with ayush and Homeopathy is one of the ingredient in the act. Our apprehensions are becoming true, as already govt has taken retrospective steps as per this act like Health officers are called for from B.Sc nursing for posting in sub centres, CCIM has already notified MS course for Ayush graduates. By 2030 govt of India is targeting to have only integrated system of medicine in medical colleges. It is big blow to modern medicine. Indian doctors are respected world wide and employed abroad on priority, will loose opportunities after this. The medical tourism to India from other countries may stop.

IMA respects all systems of medicines and wish to have all systems of medicines to practice in their own pure form. But IMA is not against integrated system of treatment to a patient providing best available treatment in every system of medicine, than a doctor burdened with knowledge of all system, making jack of all trades and master of none.

### Health and Education Policies:

IMA likes to participate with the govt in the above matters, which benefits common man. Covid-19 pandemic in last 2 years proved the need of this public private partnership (PPP) in the health delivery system. Doctors both from govt and private have sacrificed their life during covid-19 treatment, by running their clinics and medical establishment day and night through out the year. This public private partnership in future also to give best health care delivery to the public should be planed. But it should be win win situation to all concerned.

### **Covid-19 Compensation**

Govt has given call to private clinics and medical establishment to function uninterruptedly to manage covid 19 situation and to manage non-covid19 cases and promised to cover by life insurance and compensation to the treating covid19 warriors both in govt and private set up. But now steps are taken by the govt on the contrary. They are not awarding compensation to private doctors died while treating covid19 patients. IMA strongly

demands govt to take proper steps to mitigate this discrimination.

In addition to this, it was promised by the govt that it will give incentives to all its employees in govt set up involved in the treatment of covid19. But now the govt is telling that only those who worked with PPE kits will be given incentives. It is pertinent to note that those who are working in OPDs and Fields with out PPE kits are more prone to infection and are denied these fascilities. Even contract doctors are denied these fascilities, in spite of uninterrupted medical service offered. We request the govt to rectify these mistakes.

Politicians and Beurocrates have posed as medical consultants, during this covid19 pandemic with unreasonable orders and harassment to our medical officers and Higher officers of Health dept. Suicide case of Mysore district due to harassment was live example of this. IMA strongly condemns this.

### Policy of family Physician

Due to the Specialisation culture, the family physician system is weaning off. This vaccum is filled by ayush doctors and causing menace of crosspathy. This can be rectified only by remodelling health care delivery system by encouraging family physician system. PG courses in family medicine should be started to rectify this problem.

### Antibiotic policy

Resistance to antibiotics is in rising trend. It is duty of every one of us to have a

proper antibiotic policy in our medical establishments, so as to save the future generation. This year IMA will try to take steps in this field to create awareness among doctors.

### **Trade Licence**

Even though for KPME renewal, trade licence is exempted, many of our medical establishments are facing problems due to trade licence. In 2020 govt of India has included medical establishments under MSME category where the investment is less than 20 crores and turn over is less than 100 crores in a year. Majority of our medical establishments are of this nature.

Karnataka Municipalities Act 1964 (Karnataka Act 22 of 1964) and the Karnataka Municipal Corporation Act 1976 (Karnataka Act 14 of 1977) has been amended in 2015 in order to meet the objective of the Karnataka Industrial Policy 2014-2019 exempting MSME enterprises from obtaining trade licence in the jurisdiction of local bodies.

Hence those medical establishments with investment up to 20 crores and turn over less than 100 crores can register in MSME portal free of cost and get exemption from trade licence. Similarly concessional electricity charges applied for small scale industry should also be extended to the medical establishments of MSME category.

### Fire NOC

National building policy exempts building of less than 15 meters height, from fire NOC. However intent to provide fire safety measures in hospital like proper fire extinguishers, fire alarm system and other appropriate measures in proper places in the hospital has to be provided.

### IMA activities proposed in 2021-22

- 1. State working committee members will be assigned the post of district coordinator of his/her district and he/she will in turn form district council involving Presidents, Secretaries, State council members and central council members of all IMA local branches of their district. This district council will periodically meet and plan for combined activities at district level, like CME, training programme, sports meet, family get together etc. The similar sub comities of state level will also be formed at district level so as to make IMA district level activities more vibrant.
- 2. At District level, Federation of Medical Associations (FOMA) will be formed to improve the unity and cooperation among all medical associations and increase the IMA membership. The Presidents and Secretaries of all associations in the district under the chairman ship of IMA district coordinator to plan common activities in the district. IMA membership drive along with all IMA Schemes like KSSS, KSHS and KPPS is to be promoted in this platform. This will enhance, the unity among doctors of different associations and improve IMA activities.
- 3. The various sub committees will be formed under the chairmanship of able

dynamic IMA leaders to improve IMA activities as well as public health both at state, district and local IMA Branch level.

Whenever possible and feasible I request IMA local branches also to have such committees for the benefit of medical profession and public health. All IMA members will work as one team and

strengthen IMA by increasing membership at least to 30,000 this year and take IMA activities to greater heights in all spears of activities.
